Workshop Descriptions

Part 1 - Getting Ahead using Distance

Saturday June 26 1 pm til 4 pm

This workshop will help you discover how to send your dog to that jump so you can move ahead for the Front Cross or other handling maneuvers. This is not a gamblers workshop. It is aimed at new dog and handler teams and those teams that appear to be "velcroed" together at the hip :O). The goal is to get your dog off your side and looking for the obstacle that you want them to take without having to go with them.

Part 2 - Front Cross

Saturday July 10 8:30 am til 11:30 am

Uncomfortable doing Front Crosses? Feel like you are in your dog's way? Can't get there in time? Bars coming down? This is the workshop for you!

We will address flat work for front crosses and then move into basic box work. You will learn how to move and when to move!

Part 3 - Rear Cross

Saturday July 17 7:30 am til 10:30 am

Does your dog drop bars when you perform a rear cross? Does your dog spin when you make the cross? Does your dog stop at the jump and look at you :O)

We will address flatwork for rear crosses, both stationary and in motion. We will then move into basic patterns with low jumps to build your dog's confidence in what you are asking for. By the end of the workshop you should be on your way to doing basic rear crosses.

Part 4 - Serpentine

Prerequisite - Front Cross and Rear Cross or approval of the instructor

- Did you know there are 3 ways to do a serpentine?
- Can you lead out to the 3rd jump in a serpentine and signal your dog thru?

Prerequisites - Front Cross and Serpentine or approval of the instructor

- Can you do a Threadle with a pull thru or with a push thru?
- Can you do a 270 without moving into the pocket and getting behind?

Part 6 – Discriminations

Saturday Aug 21 7:30 am til 10:30 am

Strictly verbal obstacle discriminations are an awesome tool. However your body can go a long ways toward helping your dog with discriminations. There are deaf dogs running agility, how do they know which obstacle ?
